

PRESENT TENSE



Ruth plays basketball today.

PAST TENSE



Ruth played basketball yesterday.

The regular past tense = play + ed

Ruth played basketball yesterday.

Many questions use “to do” in the past tense. It isn’t regular.

Present Tense

I do
you do
he, she, it does
we do
you do
they do

Past Tense

I did
you did
he, she, it did
we did
you did
they did

When did Ruth play basketball?

Ruth played basketball last week.

Did Ruth play basketball last week?

Yes, Ruth played basketball last week.

REFERENCES FOR PRONUNCIATION OF - ED AT THE END OF A WORD.

Many past tense regular verbs end in - ed. - ed has three different sounds.

REGULAR VERBS

The -ed sounds as in do

to play – played
to live - lived
to enjoy - enjoyed
to follow – followed
to phone – phoned
to close - closed
to answer – answered

The -ed sounds as in toy.

to watch – watched
to walk – walked
to like – liked
to ask - asked
to practice - practiced

The -ed sounds as in Edward.

to need - needed
to want - wanted

ACTIVITY 1:

Examples: followed played lived answered

2. The -ed sounds as in toy.

Words that end in: p, ss, k, ce, ch, sh, *plus* - ed are usually pronounced with the t sound.

Examples: watched, walked liked asked hiked

3. The -ed sounds as in Edward.

Examples: needed wanted

To do is not a regular verb. The past tense of to do is did.

EXAMPLE: Did you play basketball yesterday?

Yes, I played basketball yesterday.

No, I did not play basketball yesterday.

No, I didn't play basketball yesterday.

Yes = past tense (played)

No = past tense = did + not + play = contraction = didn't play

EXAMPLES:

TO GO

I went
you went
he/she/it went
we went
you went
they went

TO HAVE

I had
you had
he/she/it had
we had
you had
they had

TO SEE

I saw
you saw
he/she/it saw
we saw
you saw
they saw

to find- *found*
to write - *wrote*
to put - *put*
to sit - *sat*

to begin - *began*
to eat - *ate*
to read - *read*
to study - *studied*

to come - *came*
to buy - *bought*
to meet - *met*

When a question has "did", answer in the past tense!

NEGATIVE ANSWERS

If the answer is **yes**, you use the past tense of the main verb.

Did you have a pen? Yes, I had a pen.

If the answer is **no**, use the past tense of "to do" + the main verb.

Did you have a pen? No, I didn't have a pen.

I played basketball last night. Did you play basketball, too?



No, I didn't play basketball, I played soccer.




